ETHN 107 INTRODUCTION TO NATIVE AMERICAN STUDIES

This course provides an introduction to the study of Native American histories, experiences, intellectual traditions, and forms of artistic expression. Students engage with texts that confront the structural genocide underlying the construction of the U.S. settler state, and explore Native practices of resistance, resilience, and regeneration. Course materials include fiction, poetry, spoken word, and other creative texts, as well as historical and archival studies. *Letter Grade Only. Degree Credit.*
