ETHN 265 EVOLUTION OF HIP HOP CULTURE: A SOCIO-ECONOMIC AND POLITICAL PERSPECTIVE

This course traces the evolution of Hip Hop from its African roots through the diaspora as a cultural form of expression by examining music, dancing, spoken word, philosophy, and lifestyles. Also, Hip Hop is analyzed from social, economic, and political perspectives.
