

Catalog Rights:

“Catalog Rights” means a student is held to the course requirements listed in the Cañada catalog at the time enrollment begins as long as the student maintains continuous enrollment within SMCCCD in an academic year. A student may choose to use catalog rights for the year of first enrollment or any subsequent year of continuous enrollment at Cañada, CSM or Skyline. Continuous enrollment means attending at least one term (fall, spring or summer) of each academic year. If a student discontinues enrollment and restarts, then catalog rights begin with the new enrollment.

1. Residence:

- A minimum of 60 degree-applicable units is required for an Associate Degree.
- At least 12 units must be completed at one or more of the San Mateo County Community College District (SMCCCD) colleges.

2. Scholarship:

- A 2.0 grade point average is required in all degree applicable coursework taken within the SMCCD, and all incoming degree applicable coursework taken outside the District. If a student’s cumulative GPA is below 2.0, the college may compute the GPA based solely on the courses used to satisfy degree requirements.
- All courses in the major must be completed with a grade of “C” or higher or Pass (2.0)
- A maximum of 12 units towards an associate degree or 6 units toward a certificate may be earned using the “Pass/No Pass” option
- A grade of C or higher or Pass is required for courses fulfilling Area **1A**, **1B** and **Area 2**

3. Major Requirements:

- Associate Degrees require a minimum of 18 units in the major. Use the Cañada Catalog to find the courses required for each major.
- Either 12 units or 50% of the units applied to the major, whichever is fewer, must be completed at one or more of the SMCCCD colleges.
- A grade of “C” or higher or “Pass” is required for each course applied to the major.
- Courses applied to the major may also meet general education requirements if applicable.

4. General Education (GE):

- A minimum of 25 units of General Education is required.
- If a course is approved in multiple GE areas, it can be applied to one area only.
- Students who have a BA/BS degree from an accredited institution shall be deemed to have fulfilled the GE for the AA/AS degree.
- This Associate Degree GE pattern OR completion of the transfer GE pattern Cal-GETC may be used to complete local degree general education requirements.

5. General Electives

- If courses in the major and general education requirements do not add up to the 60-unit requirement for an AA/AS degree, then additional degree-applicable elective courses must be completed to reach 60 units. Note that students may receive credit for knowledge or skills acquired through the District’s procedures for awarding credit for prior learning.
